Spending	Personal spending cash (lunches, tips, etc.)
Consumer Debt	Try for 10% of net income and use any windfalls until paid off
The Vault Account	Try for 10% of net income and adjust if contributing at work
Unallocated	Try for 10% of net income for all unallocated expenses (gifts,doc bills,etc.)
